In this program of sacred Italian music of the 17th century dedicated to the Virgin Mary, Agnès Mellon is accompanied by a lush continuo of viol, harp, lirone, theorbo and organ. The Nativity (beata) and the Passion (dolorosa) are presented as pivotal moments in Christian faith and Marian devotion. This tradition is particularly strong in the latin countries, finding expression in art and countless settings of the Magnificat, Stabat Mater and Salve Regina since the Middle Ages. The birth and death of Christ serve to represent the two extreme experiences of maternal love: the great joy of giving birth to a child and the unbearable pain of seeing His suffering and death.

Arias for soprano and violin obbligato drawn from Bach Cantatas are set among solos for cello from a Bach suite, followed by a violin sonata. German arias by Händel and Telemann of great simplicity and feeling add a meditative serenity to this lovely program.

In the text for a cantata written in 1729, the poet Marianne von Ziegler provides evidence of the already recognized importance of these three great masters, each so different from the others: "Who could have written this enchanting music? Was it Telemann, Bach or Händel?"



"There was palpable emotion in Purcell's The Blessed Virgin's Expostulation, and even more in the Première Leçon de Ténèbres by François Couperin. The expression of human passions in Giovanni Felice Sances' Stabat Mater Dolorosa evoked the suffering of the Virgin Mary before her Son's agony on the cross. Agnès Mellon's voice, which moves easily from effortless high notes to a well-supported lower range, demonstrates not only agility, but the interiority of a performer who doesn't need to rely on virtuosic effects to plumb the expressive depths of the sacred and religious texts"
